Rally of Lithgow

The Committee and Competitors of the **CarNet Auctions Rally of Lithgow** would like to take this opportunity to thank you for volunteering your services to make this event possible. Without many people like you generously giving their time these events just can't happen. As you may be in position in the Forest for several hours whilst the rally runs, we have compiled a list of things you might like to take with you to make your day comfortable. It's by no means comprehensive or compulsory – it's just stuff we have found useful.

Shelter: This can be anything from a tarp that you can tie between some trees to a 5 bedroom tent, it depends entirely on you. Unfortunately the weather is beyond our control and you can get 4 seasons in one day.

Food and Water: Nothing worse than being hot and thirsty, or cold and hungry, or any combination of the above. At this event we will provide you with some snacks and fruit and water in a small cooler pack, but you may still wish to bring some more substantial supplies. And a thermos or gas cooker for that hot cuppa or sausage sandwich.

Clothing: Same as the shelter, but a jumper, jacket, gloves, hat don't take up much room and can make the difference if the weather turns.

Light: You could still be in the forest at night and a torch or gas lantern can make life a little easier.

Toilet Paper: Well you never really know do you

Sunscreen: Well you never really know do you

Insect repellent: Well you never really know do you

Seats: A fold up chair can make life just that little bit more comfortable

Camera: Still or video, you will probably find yourself in places you would never normally have an opportunity to go to during an event and certainly closer to the action than anybody else. This can make for some great shots.

Something to Do: Unfortunately due to safety issues you will be in the forest for some time before the action starts. Although by the time you get set up have a drink and a look around for the safest spot to get some good action shots from, the course cars will probably have started to roll through. In case you are more organised than most of us, bring a book, paper, knitting, cards whatever you like, to kill a bit of time.

Your stage commander will have a detailed description of your duties and authorities which he or she will provide before you are put in position. They should be in contact with you over the next couple of weeks to confirm meeting times and places

We can't stress enough how important your place is within this event and would like to invite each and every one of you back to the Lithgow Workers Club at the completion of the event to meet up with the crews for a fair bit of lie telling and leg pulling and maybe a drink or two.
